

SNAKE RIVER CANYONS PARK

5 YEAR ACTION PLAN

2022 – 2027

Projects listed are priorities in establishing The Park's identity and for the development of Snake River Canyons Park as a regional outdoor recreational area to be utilized and enjoyed by regional residents as well as a destination for those from outside the area. This plan is considered to be a working document and may be revised, edited, and modified as needed to create a recreation area that is both safe and of benefit to the public.

Build the RV Park north of the Roger Morley arbor, with two pit toilets. Complete in 2023.

Complete the Broken Bridge with help from Jerome 2020 and the city of Twin Falls. Complete in 2023.

Identify and sign a two-track loop trail system east of Hwy 93 with a trailhead parking area for OHV, equestrians, bikers and hikers. Post user yield signs on the trail. Three more trail heads, two on 700 East and one by Devils Corral.

Identify and sign the Walgamott Stagecoach Road and Emigrant Road and make those already serving as trails a part of a loop trail system east of Hwy 93. Protect those areas of these historical roads that are not yet damaged.

Improve equestrian opportunities within The Park. Include the addition of hitching posts in trailhead areas. Build a corral at the RV park.

With IDL permission, pursue development of a non-motorized rim dirt walking path from Yingst grade to the Hansen bridge. This is a twenty year project. Start with the part US 93 to the Shoshone Falls dam.

Work with the Twin Falls Visitors Center to provide park and area information.

Work with the mountain biking community to develop a single track trail system west of Hwy 93 with trailhead parking areas that do not impact neighboring subdivision. First trail head is in. Finish trail and put up signs in summer 2022.

Work with IDL to acquire the informational kiosk in their possession. Use for RV park information.

With BLM permission, identify and sign historical sites of interest to the public.

Work with Jerome County and the shooting community to establish a safe shooting range.

Finish trail head at Don Zuck arbor. 2022

Arrange to have signage identifying SRCP on Highway 93.

Establish a native plant/pollinator garden at the trailheads.

Remove graffiti as it appears.

Continue to replace vandalized, damaged and obliterated signs in the park as needed.

Post informational fliers, TF Visitor center, Discovery center, at the Disc Golf course, sign at entrance to Roger Morley arbor, Don Zuck arbor and at the RV park.

Update signage in 2022.

Update website.

Build overlook road.

Start a speakers bureau. Six events in 2022.

Communicate information about our park in the newspaper and radio.
